Welcome to the 2025 season!

As always, I want to start by saying, "thank you!" This Club would not exist without the 500+ Members who *choose* Maplewood as their "home course". The Board, the golf course staff, and I do not take that lightly. We are grateful for those who return year-after-year and we look forward to welcoming more new Members into our community this year!

As I reflect on 2024, it was another banner year for the Club...

- Membership grew to over 500 (521) for the first time in many years
- Of the 309 who played at least once, 233 of them cashed in at least one event!
- 3rd year-in-a-row we have had 75-80% of the active membership win something

We celebrated these accomplishments and our trophy winners at our first "Member Appreciation Event" in January, which replaced our historical "Banquet". The reimagined event included a casino night, 40+ raffle prizes, 10 golf packages, a few golf trip giveaways, lunch, and plenty of laughs. Feedback from the 100 attendees was universally positive, and we are looking forward to hosting a similar event next year!

As we look forward to the 2025 season, our Tournament Director (Terry Graham), has delivered a great slate of events, including a couple of new formats. We are also going to be introducing a few changes to our pace-of-play policy, based directly on feedback provided by Members. We will be sending out the new policy ahead of the Tombstone tournament, which will be the first event we implement the new rules. We hope the changes to the policy will motivate a faster, more consistent pace-of-play throughout the round, while also providing fair opportunities for all groups to avoid being penalized. Please let us know if you have any questions and please continue to provide feedback.

2025 is also an election year for the Board of Directors. Multiple Board Members, including myself, will be transitioning out of their roles at the end of this year. We are looking for people to volunteer for the 2026-2027 term. There are a few roles to fill, including help on our Tournament Committee. If you are interested, please reach out to me. I would love to get you connected *early* and invite you to a few of our monthly Membership Meetings, so you can get acquainted before elections are held in the Fall.

In addition to roles on the Board, we are also seeking a new "webmaster" to help keep the Men's Club website updated. If you have any basic web development experience and are willing to volunteer 1-2 hours of time each month, please reach out to me. We NEED you!

2024 was an amazing year for the Club!

- Record membership numbers
- Solid participation in all 12 events (309 Different players) (1,574 total players registered)
- The events averaged 131 players per tournament a new Club record!
- \$63,674 in prize money in tournament payouts and side games

Nobody made a Hole-in-One in a tournament last year, so the Jackpot continues to grow! (\$2,380)

The tournament committee and I want to thank everyone who participated in the events in 2024. We look forward to seeing all of you in 2025!

The 2025 Tournament Series will have some changes to the schedule and the "Major" events:

- There will only be 4 "Majors" in 2025 and moving forward.
- For the Espe Team Championship and the Club Championship, all participants must have played in at least one 2025 stroke play event -or- played in one of the 2024 "Majors" to qualify.
- New Pace of Play rules will be implemented.

New for 2025

The Tournament Committee will introduce a new Championship in 2025 called "The Tournament of Champions" (TOC). To qualify for the event, individuals must win their flight (or tie) in one of the seven individual stroke play events.

The inaugural event will take place at Maplewood and will be held in late 2025/early 2026. Date TBD.

The TOC NET champion will receive a perpetual trophy recognizing his achievement.

In closing, don't forget to fix your divots and ball marks in the fairways and on the greens. Make sure to rake those bunkers too!

FROM THE HANDICAP CHAIRMAN – ZACH MANAO

Welcome back to another great season in the Maplewood Men's Club!

The wait is over, and it's time to dust off the clubs and hit the fairways! The Maplewood Men's Club is excited to welcome back all our members for another fantastic season of golf, camaraderie, and friendly competition. Whether you're a returning member or new to the Club, we have a great season ahead with tournaments, weekly games, and plenty of opportunities to improve your game.

One of the most important aspects of competitive play is the golf handicap system. Your handicap allows you to compete on a level playing field, no matter your skill level. If you don't already have one, now is the perfect time to establish your Handicap Index.

How to Get Your Handicap Index

Establishing a Handicap Index is simple and ensures you can fairly compete in our club events. Here's how you can get started:

- 1. **Post Scores** To obtain an initial Handicap Index, you'll need to submit scores for at least 54 holes. This can be any combination of 9- or 18-hole rounds.
- 2. **Use the GHIN System** Once you've posted your scores, the USGA's GHIN (Golf Handicap Information Network) system will calculate your Handicap Index.
- 3. **Stay Active** Continue to post your scores throughout the season to keep your handicap accurate and up to date.

FROM THE RULES CHAIRMAN – WILL REYNOLDS

Rule Golf With Golf Rules

A basic rule of our game lately has been playing competitions and tournaments within a set time base. Something appreciated by all, that maintain a pace of play anyway.

The USGA recommends the player make their stroke in no more than 40 seconds after they are (or should be) able to play without interference or distraction. (Rule 5.6b)

The player should usually be able to play more quickly than that and is encouraged to do so.

Play ready golf, be ready to play.

SOME READY GOLF GUIDELINES:

SCORING: If it does not affect your score for that competition, pick up your ball after reaching your posting score limit (your net plus 2) and move on.

PLAYING:

- Keep up with the group ahead.
- Try to track everyone's shots. This saves time looking for balls.
- Plan your next shot as you approach your ball. DO NOT wait until you get there.
- Be ready to play your shot when it's your turn.
- Leave your clubs or cart on the side of the green towards the next tee.
- Line up your putt while others are putting without disturbing them.
- HOLE OUT your putt if you can do so without disturbing the line of another's putt.
- If your group is behind, the first two players to hole out can move ahead to the next hole while the others finish the hole.
- After finishing a hole, go to the next tee before recording the scores.

YOU ARE OUT OF POSITION IF:

- On a par 3, the group in front of you has left the green when you arrive at the tee.
- On a par 4, the group in front of you is on the green when you arrive at the tee.
- On a par 5, the group in front of you is approaching the green when you arrive at the tee.

Keeping a pace of play helps with this as well as with our day-to-day play. Others may also be more inclined to want you in their group.
